

## Safety Information and Regulations

This information applies to all individuals entering the Industrial park Lausitz. The following restrictions apply throughout **the entire site**:



Smoking (including e-cigarettes), fire and open flames are prohibited (including in vehicles).



Bringing or consuming alcoholic beverages or other intoxicating substances (including cannabis) onto the site, as well as entering the site under their influence, is prohibited.



Photography and filming are prohibited. This applies to all types of cameras and electronic recording devices.

The ID card or day pass must be worn on outside clothing and must be visible at all times.

In **certain areas**, the following restrictions apply:



Use of mobile phones is prohibited. Exceptions can be requested via plant management.



Access for unauthorised persons is prohibited.



Potentially explosive area. Conductive (ESD) footwear must be worn. Carrying ignition sources (e. g. lighters) is prohibited.



Upon entering a plant area, you must report to the designated registration office.

**The rules of the German Road Traffic Regulations (StVO) and the Road Traffic Licensing Regulations (StVZO) apply throughout the entire site, with the following additional regulations:**



- Maximum speed limit is 30 km/h. Deviations are indicated by signs.

- Wide broken line marking: "Give way."

- Mandatory stop when exiting plant yards, crossing a lowered curb, or leaving roadside parking or loading areas.

- Parking is only permitted in designated areas and marked parking spaces.



- Rail vehicles have priority. Rail tracks must be kept clear; with a minimum clearance of 1.5 m from the outer rail edge.

- Vehicles parked in violation of regulations may be towed away at the owner's expense.



- Cyclists must wear a protective helmet.

**All orders and instructions given by site security, the site fire department, and shunting personnel must be followed immediately.**

**Any violation of the above rules and regulations may result in a ban from the site.**

### **Procedures in case of operational malfunction or accident:**

- Keep away from the location of the incident.
- In case of a medical emergency, request the ambulance from the site fire department.
- In the case of irregularities (e.g., leaking liquids, smoke, or an accident), call the site fire department.
- Within plants, facilities, and buildings, follow the instructions of the plant personnel.
- Do not walk or drive through spilled liquids, unidentified solids, dust, leaking gas, or smoke.
- Do not enter restricted areas. Do not obstruct rescue operations.
  
- In case of danger or at the sound of the acoustic emergency signal:
  - Leave the danger area, if possible, in a crosswind direction.
  - Proceed to the nearest assembly point located outside the hazard zone.
  - If in a vehicle, leave the danger area quickly without endangering others.
  - Park vehicles in such a way that no rescue or escape routes are obstructed.

### **Acoustic Signals**

Warning signal: 2 minutes



All-clear signal: 2 minutes



Information tone: sounded twice in succession



Plant alarm: not time-limited



A large number of companies located in the Industrial park Lausitz are subject to the German Hazardous Incident Ordinance (Störfallverordnung).

The competent authorities have been provided with all information required under this ordinance.

Chemical substances are processed in production plants in reactors or other equipment. These reactions often take place at high pressure and high temperatures.

Raw materials, intermediates, and finished products are stored in appropriate facilities.

At the Industrial park Lausitz, a major part of the substances listed in the Hazardous Incident Ordinance are handled. In particular, these substances can have the following characteristics: very toxic, toxic, dangerous to the environment, highly flammable, flammable, oxidising, explosive, and carcinogenic.

An incident may be caused by fire, explosion, or release of toxic substances.

The operator of the Industrial park Lausitz will take appropriate measures to prevent incidents or, in case of occurrence, limit their effects as far as possible. Internal emergency response and risk management plans have been coordinated with the competent authorities and are in accordance with external emergency response and risk management plans.
